# New Website for Maternal and Child Health

The federal Maternal and Child Health Bureau (MCHB) has a <u>new webpage</u> to feature program priorities and investments in oral health. Oral health is vital to the health and well-being of pregnant women, children, adolescents, young adults, and families. To improve oral health, MCHB aims to increase access to preventive

services, foster an integrated workforce, and achieve health equity. To do so, MCHB envisions integrating oral health within the rest of the health care system, providing culturally sensitive and cost-effective preventive care, and empowering communities and people to follow recommendations for good oral health and overall health.



#### We Want Healthy Meals in Schools

The Build Back Better Act (BBBA), formerly known as the American Families Plan, includes both a request for healthy school meals for all and for a \$1 billion healthy foods demonstration project for healthy school meals. The BBBA expands free school meals to 9 million children through the expansion of the community eligibility provision. We know how important it is for children to have healthy meals at

lunchtime to be productive throughout the school day. Eating foods that are high in sugar or carbohydrates creates acid-producing bacteria that cause tooth decay and remain on your teeth for twenty to thirty minutes after eating.
