Legislative Session Begins

This week was a big one in our state's Capitol! Governor Kelly and all the statewide elected o. cials, along with all members of the Kansas House of Representatives and a handful of Senators were sworn into office on Monday at the start of the 2023 legislative session.

The Kansas House has new leadership on both the Republican and Democrat sides this year. The new House speaker is Rep. Dan Hawkins, R-Wichita, who previously served as majority leader. His replacement is Majority Leader Chris Croft, R-Overland Park. The new presiding officer is House Speaker Pro Tempore Blake Carpenter, R-Derby.

On the Democrat side, there is change after Rep. Tom Sawyer, D-Wichita, opted not to seek another term as leader. His replacement is House Minority Leader Vic Miller, D-Topeka, and the Assistant Minority Leaders is Rep. Valdenia Winn, D-Kansas City.

What will be OHK's focus?

As we begin the 2023 legislative session, Oral Health Kansas is proud to share our policy priorities. Our top priority this year will be advocating to add denture coverage to the Kansas Medicaid dental benefits.

Last year was exciting when the legislature appropriated funding to <u>extend Medicaid dental</u> <u>benefits to adults</u>! While this was a huge victory for Kansans, we were disappointed that denture coverage was not included in the benefit package. This is the year to change that. We will be leading the charge to request an appropriation to add dentures to the Medicaid covered services. We are building a <u>webpage for the denture advocacy</u> and will be adding resources in the coming weeks.

Oral Health Kansas is recruiting state and local organizations to support the Medicaid denture advocacy. If your organization is interested in lending its name to the growing list of organizations supporting this policy change, please fill out this short form to join us in our advocacy push.
