Voter Registration Deadline in One Week

The deadline to register to vote is October 18. You can check your voter registration status, request an advance ballot, and check your polling location <u>at myvoteinfo.voteks.org</u>.

Ballotpedia is a website that shows you all the candidates in your district and shares details about the two constitutional amendments. Simply <u>enter your</u> <u>home address on the Ballotpedia website</u> to learn who and what will be on the ballot for your vote in November.

October 19: First day advance by mail ballots are mailed and advance in-person voting may begin

November 1: Deadline for votes to apply for advance mail ballot

November 8: General Election



National Dental Hygiene Month

October is National Dental Hygiene Month and this year's theme is Empowered! As a dental hygienist, how do you empower yourself or your patients? At OHK, we provide consumers with oral health <u>resources</u> to help

them make informed decisions about their oral health. Here are some simple ways to keep your mouth healthy:

- Drink tap water instead of sugary drinks
- Don't snack all day! If you're going to snack, eat it in one sitting. Less acid attacks on your teeth!
- Brush at least twice a day for two minutes
- Floss! Make it a routine to floss every day
- Visit the dentist every 6 months

Now that you have learned what you can do to keep your mouth healthy, make sure to thank your dental hygienist for the work they do to help keep your mouth healthy. Your mouth is unique and they take the time to review your history and learn about your family because they want you to have a strong bill of health!
