Today begins advanced voting for the general election. If you applied for advanced voting, you may have received an advance ballot or you can vote in person for advanced voting. If you applied for a mail in ballot, ballots will be mailed out today, October 19.

Ballotpedia is a website that shows you all the candidates in your district and shares details about the two constitutional

amendments. Simply <u>enter your home address on the Ballotpedia website</u> to learn who and what will be on the ballot for your vote in November.

Celebrating the first LGBTQIA+ Oral Health Week

This week is the first LGBTQIA+ Oral Health Week, and Oral Health Kansas is proud to participate with our partner American Institute of Dental Public Health (AIDPH). We know that members of the LGBTQIA+ community often face health disparities driven by medical bias, barriers to access, insufficient social support, and a lack of culturally competent providers.



Together, we can change that. One place to start is terminology.

During the dental visit, oral health professionals can foster a safe, inclusive environment for patients. That starts with terminology -- a foundational aspect of LGBTQIA+ health equity and education. For example, when addressing new patients, it's best avoid pronouns or gender terms like "sir" or "ma'am." Instead, ask "How

would you like to be addressed?" or simply use the person's name. In the Centers for Disease Control and Preventions guidance about terminology, they say that any accidental mis-steps in referring to patients "are almost always unintentional and can be prevented by training all staff in basic principles and strategies. All members of the health care team, from front desk staff to clinicians, can play a role in creating an environment that respects and responds to the needs (of their patients)." Remember, identity labels mean different things to different individuals, the resources below are to simply serve as a guide.
