Use Your Voice to Help More Dentists Join Medicaid

Access to dental care should not depend on where you live or how you're insured-but in Kansas, it often does. Fewer than **1 in 4 dentists** in the state accept Medicaid, and **44 counties** currently have no Medicaid dental provider at all. Western Kansas is especially impacted, where long drives and limited options make even basic dental care out of reach for many families.

But this issue isn't limited to rural areas. Even in larger cities like Wichita, people with disabilities often travel for **over an hour** just to find a dentist who accepts Medicaid and can meet their dental care



needs. The shortage of providers touches every part of the state.

To help change that, <u>Oral Health Kansas</u> and <u>Pathways to Oral Health</u> have developed a <u>Consumer Toolkit for Recruiting</u>
<u>Dentists</u>-a simple, practical guide designed for community members, advocates, and caregivers who want to make a difference.

The toolkit gives you everything you need to start the conversation:

- **Fact sheets** you can share with local dental offices.
- Sample emails, texts, and talking points for reaching out to dentists in your area.
- Social media posts and graphics to raise awareness and inspire action.
- Information about recent Medicaid improvements, including higher reimbursement rates and expanded adult coverage.
- Resources for dentists, such as provider enrollment links and <u>helpful advice on provider enrollment</u>, disability care training, and <u>My Dental Care Passport</u> to support inclusive care.

You don't need to be an expert to make a difference. Every email, call, and social post helps show Kansas dentists that their participation in Medicaid truly matters-and that our communities are ready to support them.

When more dentists open their doors to Medicaid patients, families get the preventive care they deserve, and individuals with disabilities can maintain their oral and overall health with dignity and confidence.

Together, we can close the gap in dental access-one conversation at a time.



OHK Visits with Students about Dental Careers

Abby gave a presentation about the different careers in dentistry, and students asked great questions about schooling, specialties, and experience. Introducing high school students to dental careers helps grow the workforce and expand access to care where it's needed most.



We're Headed to the 2026 National Oral Health Conference!

Oral Health Kansas submitted several proposals for 2026 National Oral Health Conference presentations, and they all were accepted! The National Oral Health Conference is the leading annual event for anyone interested in learning, networking, and advancing dental public health. The

conference is in Oklahoma City April 13-15, 2-26. We're excited to share our work with colleagues from all over the country.

- "Using Storytelling to Inspire Communities and Expand Care" is a 90-minute panel about our marketing and messaging campaigns in the Pathways to Oral Health initiative. Tara Dimick from Compass Marketing and Melanie Jacobs from our Lived Experience Advisory Group will join staff on the panel.
- "Confidence in Every Smile Tools and Training for Oral Hygiene Support" is a 90-minute panel about our new video training series for people with disabilities and caregivers. Our colleagues from Kansas Neurological Institute who are implementing the caregiver training program will join staff on the panel.
- "Elevating Voices, Driving Change, Building National Impact" is a 90-minute panel proposed by American Network of Oral Health Coalition (ANOHC) that will tell the story of national investment in oral health coalitions.
- "Small Steps, Big Impact: Practical Oral Health Projects in a Time of Limited Resources" is a 90-minute panel proposed by ANOHC that will feature several states' creative and low-cost approaches to creating educational programs. Staff will serve on the panel.
