Engaging Tribal Populations to Improve Oral Health Care

Monday, October 12 is Indigenous Peoples' Day, a holiday in the United States that celebrates and honors Native American peoples and commemorates their histories and cultures. The National Academy for State Health Policy recently finalized two oral health fact sheets,

supported by a CareQuest Institute grant. The sheets detail case studies in Oklahoma and

<u>Arizona</u> on how improving access to oral health care is important for Indigenous populations who face stark inequities in care and outcomes.

Native American and Canadian Indigenous children are experiencing a health crisis of dental disease. In these communities, children are five times more likely than the general U.S. child population to have dental disease, and they have five times as many decayed or filled teeth (on average 5.8 in children ages 2 to 5).

A new American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) policy statement, "<u>Early Childhood Caries in Indigenous Communities</u>" in the June 2021 updates the 2011 recommendations, offering treatment guidance and urgency to address this dental health crisis.

In many Indigenous communities, dental disease can be found in 90% of young children, ages 3 - 5, which means that there is much more oral surgery required - 7 times more in children from communities with a high proportion of Indigenous peoples. Learn more here.



Check your voter registration

You probably are starting to see more political ads on TV and in your mailbox. It's time to be sure you are ready for the election. Do you know who the candidates are this fall? And did you know there are two more constitutional amendments on the ballot in November? There is plenty of time to learn who and what is on the ballot on November 8 so you can be prepared to vote.

Ballotpedia is a website that shows you all the candidates in your district and shares details about the two constitutional amendments. Simply enter your home address on the Ballotpedia website to learn who and what will be on the ballot for your vote in November.

You can check your voter registration status, request an advance ballot, and check your polling location <u>at myvoteinfo.voteks.org</u>. **The deadline to register to vote is October 18.**



OHK Visits with Students

The Oral Health Kansas team is out in force this fall sharing messages around policy and the importance of good oral health.

Kathy Hunt, our dental program director, spoke to the Public Health class at Washburn School of Nursing in

Topeka. Nearly 70 students learned the latest and most important facts about oral health and its impact on overall health. We hope that they take what they learned and find ways to weave oral health into the fabric of their professional life.

Executive Director Tanya Dorf Brunner spoke to a class of 30 dental hygiene students at Concorde Career College about the role of advocacy in the dental community. She shared the reasons advocacy is necessary to improve access to dental care, especially for populations that experience the most disparities in access to care. We are always grateful for the opportunity to talk about oral health education and advocacy with future health and dental professionals.
