# Physician Assistant Students Learn about Oral Health

Over the last two years, Oral Health Kansas has collaborated with the <u>100 Million Mouths Campaign</u>, through the Center for Integration of Primary Care and Oral Health. CIPCOH is a joint endeavor of Harvard University Schools of Medicine and

Dental Medicine, the Harvard Medical School Center for Primary Care, and the University of Massachusetts Medical School's Department of Family Medicine and Community Health, in partnership with MCPHS University (formerly the Massachusetts College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences), and Stony Brook University to assist medical schools in Kansas in incorporating oral health education into their curricula. In recent weeks, Kathy Hunt, RDH, our Dental Program Director, along with Dr. Taylor Pratt, DMD, Director of Dental Services at Konza Prairie Community Health Center, and Dr. Charles Abbick, DDS, Executive Director of Dental Services at Salina Family Healthcare Center, spearheaded the 2nd Annual Oral Health Day event for the Physician Assistant Program at Kansas State University in Manhattan.

During this event, physician assistant students learned about oral health topics spanning the entire lifespan, gained practical experience in applying fluoride varnish, and observed the administration of local anesthesia in the oral cavity. One of our objectives is to enhance the students' awareness of the pivotal role oral health plays in overall well-being and bolster their confidence in applying this knowledge throughout their professional journey. The other objective is to incorporate this oral health training program into the curriculum at the K-State Physician Assistant Program. Given the interest at K-State and the physician assistant students, along with the eager participation of local dentists, it is clear we are well on our way to creating a sustainable way to ensure future physician assistants in Kansas are prepared to incorporate oral health in their practices.
