#### Improved Medicaid Dental Rates Support Patient Access and Provider Sustainability

We're gearing up for the 2026 legislative year and preparing our work for another Medicaid dental rate increase. But we need your help! The 2025 rate increase, while historic, still does not cover the significant costs of running a dental office. To ensure Medicaid dental rates are competitive with commercial rates,

Oral Health Kansas and partners are advocating for the Legislature to complete the job this upcoming legislative session.

Stay involved with the issue and share the importance with legislators, colleagues, on your social media or simply <u>signing on with your organization's name</u> to join the advocacy coalition. Together, we can strengthen the dental provider network and make sure Kansans with Medicaid coverage have access to the dental care they need. Your voice matters more than ever to help the Legislature understand why a further increase in the rates is needed to maintain and improve the dental provider network.

#### Beyond the Chair: How Dental Providers Can Support Efforts to End the HIV Epidemic

December is HIV/AIDS Awareness Month. People with human immunodeficiency virus (HIV), the virus that causes acquired immunodeficiency syndrome (AIDS), are at special risk for oral health problems. Some of the most common oral health problems for people with HIV/AIDS are chronic dry mouth, gum disease (gingivitis),

bone loss around the teeth (periodontitis), canker sores, oral warts, fever blisters, thrush (oral candidiasis), hairy leukoplakia (which causes a rough, white patch on the tongue), and tooth decay.

Oral health conditions can be painful, annoying, and can lead to other health problems. Combination antiretroviral therapy, which is used to treat HIV and restore immune system function, has made some oral health problems less common.

To help with a dry mouth, try these things:

- Sip water or sugarless drinks often.
- Chew sugarless gum or suck on sugarless hard candy.
- Avoid tobacco.
- Avoid alcohol.
- Avoid salty foods.
- Use a humidifier at night.
