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Advocacy Alert: Medicaid Dental Rates

On Monday the House Social Services Budget Committee voted to include \$6 million in state funds in the KDHE budget for a Medicaid dental rate increase. This is about half of what we asked for, but it is really good news. This incremental approach to Medicaid dental funding takes more time, but it has proven to be successful in securing new funding every year for the last four years.

Thank you to the many advocates who have provided testimony and contacted budget committee members about the need to finish the Medicaid dental rate increase. It is working!

We need your help with the next step:

1. On Monday, February 9, the full House Appropriations Committee will hear the recommendations from the House Social Services Budget Committee and vote to accept or reject them. This year remains a tight budget year, so we need to help Appropriations Committee members see the urgency of this funding.

SB 333 Fluoride Ban Update

[SB 333](#), a bill to ban community water fluoridation in Kansas, was introduced on January 15. This bill would end water fluoridation for the nearly two-thirds of Kansans who currently have access to optimally fluoridated water. Sen. Mike Thompson, who chairs the Senate Federal and State Affairs Committee, introduced the bill.

Rumors that a hearing on the bill have subsided in the wake of significant opposition. We are hopeful the bill will not move forward, but it will remain alive until the end of the session this year.

The Kansas Dental Association and Oral Health Kansas partnered on [talking points](#) about community water fluoridation. We also have information available on the website www.fluoridekansas.org.

As we wait to see whether the bill will receive a hearing, there are three things you can do:

Use [this form](#) to send an email to every member of the Senate Federal and State Affairs Committee. A sample message is available in the form, but you can edit as much as you like.

Consider whether you would like to provide testimony in opposition to the bill. If we find out about a hearing, we likely will have little time to prepare, so planning ahead for testimony will ensure we are ready. It would be ideal to share a mountain of written testimony to demonstrate how many Kansans are opposed to restricting access to optimally fluoridated water.



Kansas Mission of Mercy Provides Dental Care to Those in Need

The Kansas Mission of Mercy was held last weekend on Friday, January 30 and Saturday, January 31 in Manhattan, Kansas. With about 700 volunteers, over 600 people received the dental care they needed despite the windy chilly weather. Oral Health Kansas staff assisted with exit surveys and heard from patients how much they appreciated the care they were given.

Children's Dental Health Month Kicks Off!

February is Children's Dental Health Month and [Oral Health Kansas staff](#) wanted to join in on the fun by changing their staff pictures to a childhood picture and sharing their smiles. Did you know teaching children about oral health at a young age can help set them up for healthy habits that last into adulthood? What can you start doing? Set up a dental appointment for your child when the first tooth erupts or by the age of 1.

This will assist your child to know what a dental visit

entails, what a dentist and dental hygienist provider does at an appointment and helps ease into having someone look into their mouth besides a parent. "I took Braxton to his first dental appointment at the age of 1. I really believe this has helped him be comfortable during his dental visits and he is now 4 years old," OHK staff member Sonia Olmos shares her experience.

Kansas Has Come So Far on Adult Dental Care

Over the past four years, Kansas has made historic progress in improving dental care for adults covered by Medicaid. These investments are changing lives, strengthening communities, and rebuilding a dental provider network that has been shrinking for years.



Here's what the Kansas Legislature has already accomplished:

- 2022: Established restorative dental care for adults
- 2023: Added denture coverage for adults
- 2024: Invested in preventive dental care for adults
- 2025: \$4 million allocated for a dental rate increase to strengthen the provider network

Because of these investments, children and adults with Medicaid now have nearly comprehensive dental coverage. That is a huge milestone for Kansas.
