Dental Care Needs for Minorities

April is National Minority Health Month! Did you know nonelderly adult Kansans who are Hispanic were nearly two

times more likely to not have dental insurance than non-Hispanic Blacks or non-Hispanic Whites (63.8 percent, 33.2 percent and 32.2 percent, respectively). <u>Dental Insurance Coverage and Unmet Dental Needs in Kansas</u> report showing data available on dental insurance

coverage in the state, including detailed information on the source of dental insurance coverage, unmet dental needs and dental visits by age group and race or ethnicity. The report highlights several gaps in dental insurance coverage in Kansas and the existence of racial and ethnic disparities in coverage and utilization of dental services.

In 2021, Oral Health Kansas renewed our commitment to being an inclusive organization through the hiring of a Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion consultant to lead our organization through trainings and strategic planning. We look forward to sharing more about the improvements made within our organization in the year to come.


