## Success Begins with a Smile at Wyandotte Juvenile Detention Center

Last week the <u>Kansas City Star published an op-ed by Oral Health Kansas</u> telling the story of our new educational program with the Wyandotte Juvenile Detention Center. Sponsored by CareSource, this new educational program is called "Success Begins with a Smile" and is a way to help youth learn how and why to prioritize their oral health as they transition back to the community. They learned how food choices and

habits affect their teeth and why good oral health can help them get and keep jobs. After the first two training sessions, more than 80% of the youth reported they believe having healthy teeth is important. 


## Nursing Students Learn about Oral Health

What a good way to start off National Nurses Week when last week, staff member Kathy Hunt, visited with Washburn University nurse practitioner students in Topeka to share how they can integrate oral health into their profession. Simple ways to talk about oral health with patients is during their examination of their ears and eyes, ask if they floss and

brush or how many times. Nurses are key to oral health education because they can see warning signs in mouths for future problems and remind patients to brush and floss and watch what we eat and drink to help us stay healthy.
