Getting Ready for Kansas Elections

2022 is an election year, and we are upon election season. This year all the members of the Kansas House of Representatives are up for election, as are all four members of the Kansas Congressional delegation. The statewide elected offices also will be on the ballot. Those offices include Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of State, Insurance Commissioner, and State Treasurer.

The primary election will be Tuesday, August 2, and the general election will be Tuesday, November 8. Oral Health Kansas is ready to help you get ready to vote this year. Here is a checklist to help you get ready to vote.

1. Check your registration status:

- Click here to check your status: https://www.ksvotes.org/
- This page shows your voting location and includes an application for an advance ballot.

2. Know the deadlines:

- July 12: Deadline to register to vote in the Primary Election
- July 13: First day advance by mail ballots are mailed and advance in-person voting may begin
- July 26: Deadline for voters to apply for advance mail ballot
- August 2: Primary Election
- October 18: Deadline to register to vote in the General Election
- October 19: First day advance by mail ballots are mailed and advance in-person voting may begin
- November 1: Deadline for voters to apply for advance mail ballot
- November 8: General Election
- 3. **Check your photo ID**. The following are acceptable to meet the photo ID requirements:
- Driver's license or ID card issued by Kansas or another state
- U.S. Passport
- U.S. Military ID
- ID card issued by a Native American tribe
- Employee badge or ID issued by a government office
- Student ID card from an accredited postsecondary education institution in Kansas
- Concealed carry license issued by Kansas or another state
- Public assistance ID card issued by a government office

4. Choose how you will vote:

- Vote in advance by mail or at your election/county clerk's office.
- Vote on election day at your local polling place.

5. Research the candidates:

- Find your Kansas House of Representatives district at <a>Open States.

- The <u>Kansas Secretary of State office</u> maintains the list of all candidates in the 2022 primary and general elections.
- <u>Ballotpedia</u> includes a list of the candidates for statewide offices.
- <u>Ballotpedia</u> also has a list of the candidates for the Kansas House of Representatives.

6. **Vote!**

Throughout the next several months candidates will be knocking on doors, and there will be opportunities to visit with candidates at community forums. The State of Oral Health Equity in America

CareQuest Institute created the largest nationally representative survey, State of Oral Health Equity in America, focused exclusively on adults' knowledge, attitudes, experiences, and behaviors. The survey of more than 5,000 adults across the United States also
