

Medicaid Dental Rates in the News

Yesterday, OHK's Executive Director, Tanya Dorf Brunner and Kansas Dental Association's Executive Director, Kevin Robertson, spoke on Kansas Public Radio about the recent increase in Medicaid reimbursement rates that went into effect July 1. You can see their story at this link:

Over 75 dental professionals provided feedback about the best way to allocate the funds in order to help maximize the number of dental offices that are Medicaid providers. Nearly every Medicaid dental code increased this month. The rates increased by roughly these amounts:

Exams: 50%

Cleanings/scaling & root planing: 35%

X-rays and composite fillings: 20%

All other codes: 10%

Register Now: Building Confidence in Dental Teams to Serve People with Disabilities

Oral Health Kansas and our partners in the Pathways to Oral Health project will launch a Project Echo series in September that will help dental teams prepare to serve people with disabilities. "Building Confidence in Dental Teams to Serve People with Disabilities" is a FREE five-part virtual educational program that will help dental teams learn more about people with disabilities, how to understand and prepare for sensitivities in the dental office, and what one dental office has done to create a safe and welcoming environment for their neighbors with disabilities.

This educational series is part of the KU Medical Center's Project ECHO program, which includes a combination of presentations from experts and case study discussions among participants. Four national experts will deliver presentations about people with disabilities, dental care for people with disabilities, behavior, and sensory accommodations. Dr. Nick Rogers and Billie Donohue from Rogers Family Dentistry in Arkansas City will describe their practice's approach to embracing people with disabilities.

The sessions will run from 12:00pm to 1:00pm CST on Thursdays from September 4 through October 2. ADA CERP credit will be available for attendees. Click <u>here</u> for the flyer. World Breastfeeding Week Begins

August 1 begins World Breastfeeding Week, and this week <u>Governor Laura Kelly signed a proclamation recognizing August as "Kansas Breastfeeding Month</u>." The American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) recommends exclusive breastfeeding for about the first six months and beyond if the mother chooses.

Babies who are exclusively breastfed for the first six months are less likely to have teeth alignment issues such as open bites, crossbites, and overbites, than those exclusively breast fed for shorter lengths of time or not at all.

"Breastfeeding supports healthy smiles from the start - it helps babies develop strong jaws, proper tooth alignment, and a foundation for lifelong oral health," says Brenda Bandy, Executive Director of the Kansas Breastfeeding Coalition. "It gives every child a healthier future." Are You Ready for Back to School?

If you are like many families, you're doing back to shopping, getting kids enrolled and figuring out how you'll get them back into their routines for school, including their bedtime routines. Parents, don't worry. The Brush Book Bed model is designed for ages 0-5 but can work for kids of any age! Brush Book Bed encourages families to brush their teeth together, read a

book and go to bed at the same time every night. Kids do better with routines and expectations, and this could make bedtime a more smooth transition. It also re-enforces spending time together.

While out school shopping, add a toothbrush to your list. We should replace our toothbrushes every 3-4 months or when the bristles on your toothbrush become frayed. If you have been sick, go ahead and replace it because we don't want germs spreading. Toothbrushes do not need to be fancy, but they should be easy to use for each individual. And most importantly, don't share toothbrushes. "My son grabbed my husband's toothbrush and started brushing. I quickly tossed it in the trash and explained to my son why we don't use other people's toothbrushes", says OHK staff member, Sonia Olmos. Using someone else's toothbrush is a quick way to spread germs and cavities.
