Speaking Through Smiles: Oral Health and Youth Advocacy

<u>Families Together, Inc.</u> is a Pathways to Oral Health Project partner, and their mission is to encourage, educate, and empower families to be effective advocates for their children. Their Co-Executive Director, Tami Allen, is also Oral Health Kansas' Board President.

To serve youth with a disability, Families Together created the CHASE program. It was developed to help guide the next generation's dreams. The CHASE Program supports Kansas youth and young adults with

disabilities who are justice-involved in the foster care system or are in need of community connection. CHASE offers an 8-week personal growth and wellness program delivered through individual support for youth. Topics include positive self-talk, gratitude, values, and goal setting, among others. In addition to 1:1 support, CHASE hosts free prosocial events for youth, families, and professionals, highlighted by its annual CHASE Fest. The program aims to be a positive connection for youth by sharing tools to help them CHASE their dreams.

WSU and FHSU Take Steps Toward a Dental School

Wichita State University (WSU) and Fort Hays State University (FHSU) have announced the WSU Board of Trustees has approved a feasibility study to explore creation of the state's first dental school. The two schools plan to partner on the dental school project.

The feasibility study is set to be completed in the fall of 2026 and "will evaluate the scope, scale and structure of a potential dental school based in Wichita, with a presence in rural Kansas through Fort Hays State. Key areas of focus include cohort size, faculty and staff needs, accreditation requirements, facility planning and potential partnerships with Federally Qualified Health Centers to expand clinical access.
