Oral Health Kansas Recognizes Juneteenth

Last week the Oral Health Kansas Board of Directors voted to add <u>Juneteenth</u> as a holiday recognized by the organization. In 2021 Juneteenth was adopted as a national holiday, and states and organizations have been following that lead ever since. Oral Health

Kansas is committed to being an anti-racist organization, and recognizing the federal holiday as an organizational holiday is one small step. Juneteenth is the celebration of the end of slavery in the United states and commemorates the date in 1865 on which the last enslaved people learning that they had been emancipated.

Including Dentists in the Cancer Care Team

In an article published today, the health care news source <u>Healio</u> highlights the critical link between oral health and cancer treatment. The article features the work of Dr.

Dala Alhajji from the New York University College of Dentistry. Dr. Alhajji discusses the potential lifelong oral health problems that can arise when dental problems are not treated before cancer treatment begins. For example, if a tooth infection flares up during cancer treatment it is difficult for a dentist to intervene because the person is experiencing immunosuppression. This can lead to tooth loss. She also describes some of the recommendations she gives people undergoing cancer treatment such as using an ultrasoft toothbrush because they may experiencing prolonged bleeding while they are immunosupressed.

Dr. Alhajji says, "The oncologists I work with have been great about referring patients to me because they see the impact it has." Read more to learn how and why making dental treatment an early part of the cancer treatment process protects people from having lifelong eating and communications problems.



Speak with Candidates This Election Season

As we move toward the general election on November 8, you may have the opportunity to speak with candidates before election day. Whether you attend a candidate forum or visit with candidates who knock on your door, take advantage of these opportunities by ensuring oral

health is part of the conversation! Ask candidates questions about oral health policy issues to help increase their awareness and ensure oral health remains part of the conversation once they are elected. Start conversations also helps you learn which candidate you want to vote for on election day.

State Level Races

- What is your position on expanding Medicaid/KanCare for adults who fall in the coverage gap?
- What are your thoughts on increasing access to dental care for KanCare beneficiaries, such as denture coverage?
- What do you think about allowing people to have access to teledental services, especially in rural areas?

Congressional Races

- What are your thoughts on including dental coverage in basic Medicare coverage?
- What is your position on increasing CDC funding to support oral health programs in each state?

How to Find Candidate Forum

- Find a list of candidates at your local election or county clerk's office.
- Follow candidates on social media to learn when they'll be in town.
- Check the newspaper and local media for candidate forum announcements.
