## Healthy Aging Month


September is Healthy Aging Month and a reminder that the health care needs of older adults are different from those of younger people. By 2060, according to the US Census, the number of US adults aged 65

years or older is expected to reach 98 million, 24% of the overall population. Older Americans with the poorest oral health tend to be those who are economically disadvantaged, lack insurance, and are members of racial and ethnic minorities. Having a disability, living in a nursing facility, or homebound also increases a person's risk of poor oral health.

In addition to facing dental diseases, older adults also experience nutrition and access to service challenges. Older adults and their caregivers may not have the skills to protect their oral health with daily at home oral hygiene. They may choose foods that are convenient, which are often high in carbohydrates, and many older people may have limited access to fresh vegetables and fruits. Many older adults do not have the funds necessary to access dental care, and Medicare does not cover dental services. OHK has resources available to help older adults:

- Adaptive Aids for Toothbrushing has some products that can help adapt toothbrushing routines. Available for free download <u>here</u>.
- <u>Changing it Up</u> provides routines to help with toothbrushing when it's challenging.
